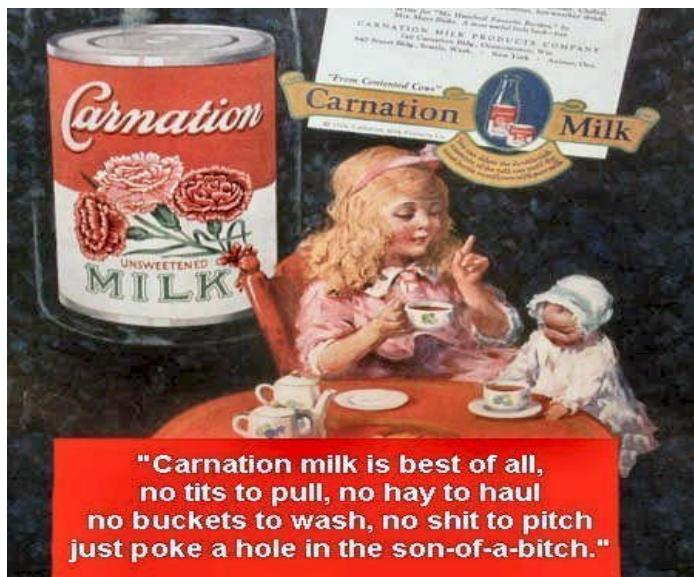
This will warm the cockles of your heart! Carnation milk - 65 YEARS AGO
